



John T. Rice Infant & Nursery School Pupil Premium Expenditure 2017-2018

Pupil Premium is a specific allocation of funds, additional to main school funding, which the Government believes is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children who are in receipt of free school meals (FSM) and their peers. The Government believes that the allocation of Pupil Premium will tackle disadvantage by reaching the pupils who need it most.

Below are details of our Pupil Premium allocation for 2017-2018, how it was spent and the impact it has had on the children in our school.

In 2017-2018 we were allocated a total of **£33720** Pupil Premium funds.

Barriers to future attainment (for pupils eligible for PP)	
Barriers	Success Criteria
1. Significant speech and language difficulties on entry to school	Speech and Language therapist has worked with children who are waiting for/discharged from therapy to aid oracy and therefore writing. Improve speech and language of at risk pupils in the Early Years. Children are making good progress so that they make ARE by the end of the year.
2. Pupil premium engagement and social skills development through after school club.	PP children accessing after school clubs so that social skills are developed and attitudes to school/learning are improved.
3. Many pupils lack experiences to draw on in their learning.	Children to have access to a wide range of experiences through 'Wow' moments provided by visits and visitors. Pupils are using experiences in their learning to make good progress so that they make ARE by the end of the year.
4. Lack of parental support and engagement both prior to starting school and whilst at school.	Pupils have received the support necessary to make accelerated progress to meet their individual targets.
